Brittany Smith as Susanna and Jonathan Harris as Figaro Figaro and Susanna, servants of the Count and Countess Almaviva, look forward to their wedding day. When Figaro reveals that the Count has given them quarters immediately joining those of their masters, Susanna becomes suspicious of the Count's motivations, and implies that the Count wishes to seduce her. Figaro becomes jealous at this revelation.

Cosa mi narri! ... Sull'aria

Nola Richardson as Susanna and Lindsey Chinn as Contessa Almaviva Hoping to expose the philandering Count, the Countess dictates a note to Susanna inviting the Count to a secret assignation in the garden "under the pines." They agree that the rest of what is implied "he will understand."

Deh prendi un dolce amplesso Kesley Robertson as Sesto and Rachel Abrams as Annio Annio, Sesto's friend, wants to wed Servilia, Sesto's sister. The two men affirm their friendship.

When Idamante asks his father why he sends him away, Idomeneo can only reply that the youth must leave. Ilia asks for consolation from Electra, who is preoccupied with revenge. They all struggle with their conflicting emotions in a quartet.

Maria Brea as Konstanze

Konstanze, a prisoner of Pasha Selim, explains to the latter her faithful love for Belmonte, with whom she has been so happy. She laments that now she knows only sorrow, grief, and tears.

Dorabella convinces Fiordiligi that a little harmless flirtation is not a breach of their promises to their absent lovers. Unwittingly, they choose each other's disguised fiancées as their new partners.

Jennifer Moore as Fiordiligi and Samual Keeler as Ferrando Fiordiligi, afraid of her feelings, plans to join Guglielmo on the battlefield, but Ferrando interrupts her and asks her to either accept his love or to slay him. Fiordiligi gradually weakens and then gives in, and they sing of their passion in a rapturous duet.
