ABOUT BEL CANTO BOOT CAMP

Bel Canto Boot Camp was born during the pandemic when we reached out to singers around the world – singers who had no place and seemingly no reason to sing. We created **The Vaccai Project** – a unique online training course for singers. Just short of two thousand singers from America to South Africa, from Colombia to Russia practiced together for the day when stages would be open to them again and theaters would be filled with audiences. We published The Vaccai Project in book form in April 2022.

Now, as the world continues to emerge from Covid-19, Bel Canto Boot Camp strives to support artists in the physical world as we did (and continue to do) virtually. The Vaccai project is now available in book form at Amazon. BCBC recently announced a new partnership with Guild Hall of East Hampton: **The Guild Hall & Bel Canto Boot Camp Resident Artist Series** – a unique training and performance collaboration between operatic superstars, established professional singers, and promising singers still on the verge of an international career. In the summer of 2022 BCBC presented its first in person **training week in New York City**.

BCBC Beyond NYC is a new initiative aimed at reaching singers and teachers in person both nationally and internationally. We are committed to decentralizing resources in the training of the unamplified voice. Our goal is to recreate residency programs similar to the one in East Hampton to train more singers and to train them in their communities where we can reach more singers and where we can help local organizations cultivate local audiences to support local artists.




Rachelle Jonck received her musical training at the Conservatory of the University of Stellenbosch. In her native country she was awarded a FNB/Vita award for her contribution to opera in South Africa. In 1998 Ms Jonck received the Nederburg Opera Prize – South Africa's premier opera award. Rachelle moved to New York City as Head Vocal Coach and Assistant Conductor of Bel Canto at Caramoor. Her private coaching studio includes established professionals whose careers take them to the largest opera houses of the world, and younger singers still on the verge of a professional career. Her master class topics, while related to her main study field of bel canto, explore the wider application of the bel canto way of singing.



Derrick Goff is an alumnus of the Metropolitan Opera's Lindemann Young Artist Development Program and has returned at the MET music staff. He has enjoyed many years of collaboration at Teatro Nuovo, a continuation of the young artist program of Bel Canto at Caramoor, where he is resident as a coach, chorus master, and Italian teacher. In addition to his work as a pianist, coach, and conductor, Derrick holds degrees in organ and voice from Westminster Choir College.





NEW YORK CITY SUMMER TRAINING WEEK

Advance preparation for Guild Hall & BCBC Resident Artist Series

To make a real difference in singers' approach to learning, coaching, rehearsing, and performing, we invite resident artists to a week of training in NYC where we introduce key concepts in preparation for our work in East Hampton at no cost to them.

BCBC also invites prospective Guild Hall resident artists to the NY training week at no cost to them to investigate their suitability for East Hampton residencies.

Access to low cost in person training for BCBC members and non-members

BCBC members are invited to join Guild Hall Resident Artists in training and performance during the New York City training week. Singers who cannot afford the nominal fee are invited to apply for scholarships.

If all available positions are not filled with members, BCBC makes slots available to non-members at the same low or no cost rates.



At BCBC there is no judgment - only collaboration. The goal is simply to make beautiful music using the skills and perspectives of everyone in the room. RESIDENT ARTIST SERIES AT GUILD HALL OF EAST HAMPTON

The Guild Hall & Bel Canto Boot Camp Resident Artist Program awards paid residencies in the Hamptons to emerging artists identified by an application and audition process. Guest artists at the height of international singing careers are invited to join resident artists as both mentors in masterclasses and colleagues in concerts – a unique training and performance collaboration between operatic superstars, established professional singers, and promising singers still on the verge of an international career.

The Guild Hall & BCBC Resident Artist Series in East Hampton is currently funded by the **V. Atkins Foundation** via Guild Hall. This allows BCBC to commit internal resources to day to day expenses and BCBC and beyond NYC intiatives.

BEL CANTO SUNDAY MATINÉES BRINGING ARTISTS AND AUDIENCES TOGETHER

The Bel Canto Boot Camp Matinee series, established in the spring of 2020, is an education initiative for the benefit of artists and audiences alike. In every session, we explore aspects of the rich recorded history of musicmaking, with an emphasis on singers of the past. The earliest operatic recordings, dating back as far as 1889, provide modern listeners with a glimpse of vocal technique and musical taste as it existed in generations of performers whose stylistic roots lie in the era of the great operatic compositions. The earliest of these singers never knew of the existence of the microphone or electronically amplified musical reproduction. By listening to artists such as Lilli Lehmann, Mattia Battistini, Adelina Patti, we hear the true bel canto approach. Later artists, like Caruso, Ponselle, Muzio, Martinelli and Ruffo, show the influence of changing styles and developing technological possibilities on singers as the 20th Century progressed. The recent emergence of streaming and YouTube has made hundreds of these recordings available to all.

BCBC Matinees provide a curated guide to these treasures.

Missouri-born tenor Steven Tharp's operatic credits include performances with the Metropolitan Opera, New York City Opera, Netherlands Opera, among many other houses. Handel and Mozart are well represented in Mr. Tharp's repertoire of more than 60 operatic parts, and his keen interest in 18th- and early 19th-century opera has led to many roles in operas of Gluck, Haydn, Scarlatti, Conti, and others. In concert, Mr. Tharp has appeared with the New York Philharmonic, Chicago Symphony, Philadelphia Orchestra, and the Cleveland Orchestra, among others. His concert repertoire includes the Bach, Mozart, Handel, and Haydn masterpieces of the 18th and 19th century and extends to Elgar's Dream of Gerontius, Schönberg's Gurre-Lieder, the Verdi Requiem, and Britten's War Requiem. A dedicated song recitalist, Mr. Tharp has appeared at New York's Metropolitan Museum of Art, the 92nd Street Y, Carnegie's Weill Hall, venues in Europe, Japan, and South America. His interest in musical theater and cabaret led to his appearance in 3 Tenors in Search of an Act in a sold-out run at Don't Tell Mama in New York, Steven has recorded for Decca, Delos, Newport, Albany and Naxos, earning a Grammy Award nomination. He has also served as stage director for the Manhattan School of Music and for Caramoor. He lives in Columbia, Missouri with his adorable Westie, Hector, and is Associate Professor of Voice at the University of Missouri.


THE FUTURE: BCBC plans to expand Bel Canto Sunday Matinée to a podcast which will allow a larger audience to access this essential content at their leisure.



BEL CANTO BOOT CAMP ONGOING RESEARCH PROJECTS

Bel Canto Boot Camp counts amongst its members and supporters a wide variety of educators, voice scientists and medical professionals. While our work is based in history, we engage with those in the wide unamplified voice community to discover how history can be explained by science. Most singers do better when technique is de-mystified by some simple facts that can easily be applied in practice. BCBC has hosted writers Conrad L. Osborne, Kenneth Bozeman, and Will Crutchfield in exploration of the connection (or sometimes lack thereof) between the past and the present as we look to the future.

Current pending projects include the development of presentation master classes which will seek to explore the **training of laryngeal function in the bel canto repertoire**. This work is of interest to those in the medical field specializing in recovery after vocal trauma and surgery and we are looking forward to engage with leaders in that field in 2023

What you see is an increase in **auditory roughness** when she is in chest voice – partials close to each other are boosted.

GLOBAL MUSICAL LITERACY

A LONG TERM DREAM TO EMPOWER SINGERS AND AUDIENCES

Bel Canto Boot Camp believes that the future of the arts depends on the musical literacy of its audience as much as it does on the education of its practitioners.

Music is a language and music notation is its alphabet. The **increasing global absence of music education in our schools** leads to audiences which experience performances (and recordings) without the ability to participate in music making themselves. Moreover, such audiences are dwindling. Even more alarming is the number of would-be singers who are hampered by lack of musicianship skills originating in lack of proficiency in reading music notation.

Most programs teaching music notation are focused on children learning musical instruments – and often at a very early age. This non-inclusive model depends on the presence of a piano, a violin, a flute – most often attached to the affluence of the family. Singers who were not trained as instrumentalists at an early age tend to lag behind in music school and never truly catch up with their instrumental peers. The simple truth is that a singer cannot start rigorous training until after puberty – we owe it to them to right this wrong.

BCBC seeks partners interested in joining us in developing **free online musical literacy programs** geared towards young adults and adults based on the use of the unamplified voice as the vehicle for putting sound to symbol. **Why not use the instrument we all have?**

The human voice was always the gateway to musical literacy and participation. It is truly the mother of all instruments. Instrumentalists strive to make their instruments "sing" every day and while the best of the best achieve this, nothing truly compares with the beauty and intimacy of the unamplified voice.

Today scores are as freely available online as recordings. Buying sheet music used to be impossibly expensive. Why not celebrate the availability of musical texts by teaching the world to read them?

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


WHERE WE HAVE BEEN WHERE WE ARE GOING
